Visitation Reminders

QSO-20-39 (Revised Sept. 23, 2022)

- Community transmission = High
 - Everyone should wear a mask.
- Community transmission ≠ High
 - Masks are still the safest option, but facility can choose not to require visitors to wear a face covering.
- While visiting in rooms masks are not required.





Visitation During an Outbreak

- Outbreak = single new case.
- Visitors to be made aware of risk of visiting during an outbreak.
- Face coverings should be worn during visits.
- Visit in resident's room.
- Limit visitor movement in the facility.





Communal Activities

Safest for everyone to wear a face covering.







New Visitation Resources

Superior Health Quality Alliance (Superior Health) developed four new posters for nursing homes related to visitation:

- General Visitation
- COVID-19 Outbreak
- High Community Transmission
- Reduce Spread

ATTENTION VISITORS

Our community is experiencing a HIGH COVID-19 transmission rate. For your safety and others, we recommend you:

- Wear a well-fitting facemask that covers your mouth and nose.
- Limit your visit to the resident's room or designated visitor area.
- Maintain social distancing when in the presence of others.





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Residents Leaving the Facility

- Residents are allowed to leave the facility as they choose.
- Encourage families to:
 - Use face coverings.
 - Perform hand hygiene.
- Quarantine is <u>not recommended</u> for residents who leave the facility for < 24 hours.
 - If a resident leaves for longer than 24 hours, they should be managed as a new admission.



Timely Use of COVID-19 Therapeutics

QSO-23-03-ALL

Providers should:

- Ensure their residents are protected against transmission of COVID-19 within their facilities.
- Receive appropriate and timely treatment when tested positive for the virus.
- Continue to implement appropriate infection control protocols for COVID-19 and influenza.


Enhancing the Family Visit During the Holidays
