## CONSIDERATIONS FOR LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES ON ACQUIRING COVID-19 VACCINATION RESOURCES

The purpose of this document is to provide long-term care facilities (LTCFs) with information about acquiring COVID-19 vaccination resources for staff and residents. All LTCF staff members are categorized as <u>health care personnel</u>, the highest priority group for receiving the vaccination, and are eligible for vaccination now. As a reminder, the COVID-19 vaccine is free of charge to all people living in the United States. No one can be denied a vaccine if they are unable to pay the vaccine administration fee.

## OPTIONS FOR LTCF STAFF MEMBERS TO GET VACCINATED

- Receive on-site vaccination through facility agreements with an LTC pharmacy, through a federal pharmacy partnership, or by becoming an LTC Vaccination Program as described in "Options for LTCFs to Acquire COVID-19 Vaccines for Residents and Staff."
- Choose to be vaccinated by health department clinics or other local vaccination providers.
