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3. MEDICARE AND MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT

Medicare Reimbursement

HCPCS Code	Description
G1028	Take-home supply of nasal Naloxone; 2-pack of 8mg per 0.1 mL nasal spray
G2215	Take-home supply of nasal naloxone; 2-pack of 4mg per 0.1 mL nasal spray
G2011	Alcohol and/or substance (other than tobacco) abuse structured assessment (e.g., AUDIT, DAST-10), and brief intervention, 5-14 minutes
G0396	Alcohol and/or substance (other than tobacco) abuse structured assessment (e.g., AUDIT, DAST-10), and brief intervention, 15 to 30 minutes
G0397	Alcohol and/or substance (other than tobacco) abuse structured assessment (e.g., AUDIT, DAST-10), and intervention greater than 30 minutes

Medicaid Reimbursement

Check with your state Medicaid agency about which billing codes to use.

HCPCS Code	Description
G0396	Alcohol and/or substance (other than tobacco) abuse structured assessment (e.g., AUDIT, DAST-10), and brief intervention, 15 to 30 minutes
G0397	Alcohol and/or substance (other than tobacco) abuse structured assessment (e.g., AUDIT, DAST-10), and intervention greater than 30 minutes
G0442	Annual alcohol misuse screening, 15 minutes
G0443	Brief face-to-face behavioral counseling for alcohol misuse, 15 minutes
G0444	Annual depression screening, 15 minutes
H0049	Alcohol/and/or drug screening
H0050	Alcohol and/or drug services, brief intervention, per 15 minutes

Bundled Payments for Substance Use Disorders Under PFS

HCPCS Code	Description
G2086	Office-based treatment for a substance use disorder, including development of the treatment plan, care coordination, individual therapy and group therapy and counseling; at least 70 minutes in the first calendar month.
G2087	Office-based treatment for a substance use disorder, including care coordination, individual therapy and group therapy and counseling; at least 60 minutes in a subsequent calendar month.
G2088	Office-based treatment for a substance use disorder, including care coordination, individual therapy and group therapy and counseling; each additional 30 minutes beyond the first 120 minutes. (List separately in addition to code for primary procedure).

For more Bundled Payments information:

- In the CY 2020 PFS final rule, CMS finalized the creation of new coding and payment describing a bundled episode of care for the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder (OUD). In the CY 2021 PFS final rule, CMS revised the code descriptors for HCPCS codes **G2086**, **G2087** and **G2088** by replacing “Opioid Use Disorder” with “Substance Use Disorder” to be inclusive of all SUDs.
- Don’t bill HCPCS codes **G2086–G2088** more than once per month per patient since these codes describe treatment for one or more SUDs.
